

COURSE DESCRIPTIONS:

- NYS Use of Force and Firearms- probably the most critical course in the entire concealed carry series, this will deep dive into civilian use of firearms in self defense situations. This is a non shooting class.
- Concealed Carry- USCCA Curriculum basic defensive handgun course for those who carry, or are considering carrying a handgun for self-defense. USCCA Concealed Carry is an informational and hands-on class in the carrying and use of a handgun in self-defense. Non live fire class.
- Defensive Shooting 1&2- This is USCCA curriculum and each level has a text book, a required e-learning component and then a full range day. Level 1 begins with working from a holster and will have students moving and shooting at the conclusion of Level 1. Level 2 continues to build upon Level 1 concepts and contains more challenging shooting scenarios.
- Home Defense- USCCA curriculum based on self defense while inside the home. Non live fire course.
- Active Shooter Awareness- Designed to guide community members how to respond to an active shooter situation. This course is intended to prepare individuals (non-law enforcement personnel) to react appropriately to such a situation. The desired outcome of the training is to encourage decisive action to any rapidly unfolding, life-threatening situation. Non shooting course.
- Protecting Houses of Worship- Intended for leadership, congregation and worshippers to be provided with the tools needed to develop and formalize an emergency action plan, help develop a security team and prepare those not on a security team but still in attendance of the house of worship. Non shooting course.
- Scenario Based Training- Comprehensive training that focuses on reality based scenarios. Students will incorporate mindset, situational awareness and decision making skills. Not a live fire course. Students will use SIRT pistols, air soft and/or marking cartridges.
- Pistol/Medical/Trauma Courses- With modern firearms more concealable and accessible and advances in medical technology, it is critical to learn basic and intermediate handgun skills and matching lifesaving skills. Firearms and medical skills go hand in hand.
- TCCC (Tactical Combat Casualty Care)- A more in depth life saving course based on the MARCH algorithm. Non shooting course.
- VCAT- Vehicle Counter Ambush Tactics; shooting in around cars, use of cover, shooting through auto glass.
